The power to defeat this project lies with us. The Line In The Sand political action committee was formed in response to tone-deaf city leadership that has not yet heard the voice of the people crying out that enough is enough. We need a paradigm shift in Newport Beach away from accommodating developer requests.

If the City Council follows their expected path of approving this enormous construction and denying the residents a voice through a Greenlight vote, the Line In The Sand PAC will seek to qualify a referendum against it.
